SO, THAT'S ONE OF THE REASONS THAT WE -- THAT WE PRACTICE IN THIS TRADITION. SO, WITH THE BELL THAT WE WILL USE TONIGHT WE WILL JUST INVITE, INVITE IT THREE TIMES. IT WILL BE A CHANCE FOR US TO SETTLE OUR BODIES, AND OUR HEARTS AND OUR MINDS. AND IN ORDER TO LISTEN MORE DEEPLY TO WHAT WE WILL BE HEARING TONIGHT. SO WITH THAT I WILL INVITE THE BELL, THREE TIMES. POLITICAL AND ECONOMIC SYSTEMS THAT DENY ONE PERSON THESE RIGHTS HARM THE WHOLE HUMAN FAMILY. WE MUST BEGIN BY BECOMING AWARE OF WHAT IS HAPPENING TO EVERY MEMBER OF THE HUMAN FAMILY. AND I HAVE THE HONOR TO INTRODUCE TONIGHT TO YOU, CAMILO MONTOYA, AND, A MULTIMEDIA STORYTELLER FROM NICARAGUA AND CAME TO SILVER SPRING, MARYLAND WITH HIS FAMILY IN 2013, WHEN HE WAS 12 YEARS OLD. HE IS BEST KNOWN IN THE AREA FOR HIS ORIGINAL SPOKEN WORD PERFORMANCES, PRESENTED AT THE

STRATMORE AND KENNEDY CENTER. BACK HOME IN NICARAGUA, HE
HAS MADE A NAME FOR HIMSELF WORKING WITH THE NICARAGUAN
FREEDOM COALITION AND ALLIANCE OF NICARAGUA, ADN, SHORTLY
AFTER HIS NOMINATION FOR BEST DIRECTOR AT THE NATIONAL
STUDENT PRODUCTION, EMMYS IN 2020, CAMILO FOUNDED THE SLICE
FOR LIFE PRODUCTIONS, A VIDEO PRODUCTION COMPANY COMMITTED
TO RACIAL JUSTICE AND COMMUNITY BUILDING. HE PARTNERS WITH
NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS AND BUSINESSES THAT DIRECTLY
BENEFIT THE LATINO, THE LATINX COMMUNITY. WE ARE SO EXCITED
TO LEARN MUCH MORE ABOUT CAMIOL'S EXPERIENCE AND HOW HE HAS
FOUND, COMMUNITY, THROUGH ACTIVISM. CAMILO, THANK YOU SO

>> CAMILO MONTOYA: GREAT. MY NAME IS THE FIRST SLIDE. THE REASON THAT I CHOSE THAT, AS THE FIRST SLIDE WAS, BECAUSE OF HOW MUCH I HAVE STRUGGLED WITH THAT NAME. I HAVE FOUR MORE LIKE MY MIDDLE NAME, MY MOM'S LAST NAME. CAMPOS.

CAMILO

MONTOYA IS THE WAY THAT I MOVE THROUGH THE WORLD. I CHOSE
THAT NAME BECAUSE -- I HAVEN'T ALWAYS BEEN PROUD OF SAYING
THE NAME OUTLOUD OF BEING UNAPOLOGETICALLY LATINO WHICH IS
I GUESS HOW I WOULD DESCRIBE MYSELF NOW. IT'S CLEARLY LIKE,
LIKE NOT A U.S. NAME OR, A WHITE, WHATEVER NAME, IT'S -IT'S VERY, VERY MUCH HISPANIC, VERY LATINO. AND HAS A THE
LOW OF HISTORY. HAS A THE LOT OF -- LIKE FAMILY HISTORY. MY
COUNTRY'S HISTORY. MY PEOPLE'S HISTORY. AND SO -THAT'S WHAT, LIKE SEEING MY NAME IS WEIRD TO ME. BECAUSE I,
I HAVE ALWAYS STRUGGLED WITH IT. I WILL GO INTO IT SOME
MORE. BEFORE I DO THAT. I JUST -- I WANTED TO SHOW THIS

TIME OF THE YEAR IS TOUGH FOR ME. NOT BECAUSE IT IS TAX SEASON. BECAUSE TAXES ARE PRETTY GOOD FOR ME THIS YEAR. IT WAS, MY RETURNS TALKING ABOUT. IT IS JUST THIS TIME FROM THE 18th OF APRIL TO, LIKE AROUND THIS TIME IS, IS A VERY SYMBOLIC TIME FOR ME IN MY LIFE. BECAUSE TWO YEARS AGO, THREE YEARS AGO, IN 2018 WAS WHEN THE UPRISINGS BEGAN IN MY HOME IN NICARAGUA AGAINST THE ORTEGA REGIME, DICTATORSHIP THAT HOLDS MY COUNTRY. AND IT -- THREE YEARS AGO, THE UPRISING BEGAN, PROTESTS, POLICE BRUTALITY WAS, WAS OUT, OUT THERE WITH, WITH NO FILTER, AT ALL, NO SHAME, NO NOTHING. IT WAS MURDERING AND KIDNAPPING AND HARASSING, IT ALL BEGAN THREE YEARS AGO. ON THE, BETWEEN THE 18th AND 19th. THE VERY IMPORTANT DATE. FOR NICARAGUANS. FOR ME IT REPRESENTS MY FIRST AWAKENING I WOULD CALL IT. MY FIRST TIME, SORT OF -- UNDERSTANDING FINALLY WHO I WAS --GETTING A SENSE OF WHAT I AM SUPPOSED TO DO. STARTED ME OUT IN THE JOURNEY I AM IN NOW (SPEAKING SPANISH) MY FIGHT, MY STRUGGLE, THAT HAS -- SHAPED, SHAPED ME INTO WHO I AM NOW. SO MY NEXT SLIDE IS SOME PICTURES OF ME. WITH MY CAMERA. IT KIND OF SYMBOLIZES WHEN THE TWO JOURNEYS THAT -- THAT'S EVENTUALLY COLLIDED AND MADE, MADE ME WHO I AM NOW. YOU KNOW, VIDEOS, CAMERAS KIND OF, WAS THE STRUGGLE FOR ME.

WASN'T GIVEN TO ME. IT WAS SOMETHING THAT I REALLY HAD TO WORK FOR. REALLY HAD TO -- ONE UP MYSELF EVERY TIME TO GET TO THE POINT WHERE I COULD -- PULL THE CAMERA -- HOLD THE CAMERA IN MY HAND. I, IT TAUGHT ME -- SO -- YOU KNOW MY PARENTS COULDN'T GET ME THE CAMERA, THAT I NEEDED TO GET STARTED. SO -- THAT'S WHEN I STARTED WORKING. SO I STARTED WORKING AT, AT A CHINESE RESTAURANT IN BETHESDA. BACK THEN IT WAS, MY FIRST JOB, EVER. SO IT TAUGHT ME A LOT, TAUGHT ME THE VALUE, VALUE ANYTHING, ANY MATERIAL POSSESSIONS IN ANY WAY HELPED ME IN MY JOURNEY. THE CAMERA I AM HOLDING RIGHT THERE, IS MY FIRST CAM REFER. I WORKED SO HARD TO GET. I WORKED, LIKE, LIKE -- OVER THE SUMMER. GOING INTO MY SOPHOMORE YEAR, WORKING DOUBLE SHIFTS. I WOULD COME IN AT 7:00 IN THE MORNING TO DO THE BREAKFAST, MORNING SHIFT. I WOULD LEAVE AT 11:00 AT NIGHT TO DO THE NIGHT SHIFT. SO I COULD BUILD LIKE, SAVE ENOUGH MONEY TO BUY THE CAMERA THAT I WANTED SO I COULD --DO MY VIDEOS, THIS PASSION OF MINE, HAS TAKEN ME VERY FAR IN MY LIFE. WAS SOMETHING THAT I REALLY HAD TO WORK FOR. IT WASN'T SOMETHING THAT LIKE I SAID BEFORE, THAT WAS GIVEN TO ME. THAT'S ONE PART OF MY JOURNEY. MY OTHER PART OF THE SKWURPBY WHICH IS THIS. REALLY FUNNY SLIDE. (JOURNEY) AND

THAT IS GOING FROM CAM TO MILO, HAVING MY TWO SORT OF NICKNAMES THAT I HAVE, GROUPED AROUND MY LIFE WITH. CAM WAS THAT, WAS THAT, ASSIMILATED, THAT, THAT WHITE PASSING, LIKE VERSION OF MYSELF. THAT, I STRUGGLED WITH FOR MANY YEARS. THAT WAS -- HOW I MOVED AROUND MY HIGH SCHOOL. BCC, PREDOMINANTLY WHITE, PREDOMINANTLY WEALTHY, WHITE PEOPLE. IN MY AREA. SO THE WAY, YOU KNOW -- THAT IS MY EXPERIENCE OF WHITE MAN IN THE BETHESDA AREA, MOVES, WHITE KID IN BETHESDA, MALE IN BETHESDA AREA MOVES IS VERY, JUST, JUST, STROLLING BY, NOT REALLY CARING, JUST, LIKE MAKING FUN OF THINGS, AND, VERY RELAXED. IS SORT OF HOW, HOW, I WAS TAUGHT THAT, THAT GUYS MOVE. THAT'S HOW, THAT'S HOW THE BOYS MOVE. IN OUR AREA. IN OUR SCHOOL. I EMBODIED THAT COMPLETELY. CUT MY HAIR SHORT. I WEAR MY WHITE VANS. MY, MY, NIKE SOCKS. AND JUST -- WEARING A HAT BACKWARDS ALWAYS. IT WAS ALWAYS -- THAT'S WHAT I THOUGHT AT THE TIME I HAD TO DO TO FIT IN. AND IN A WAY I WAS ACCEPTED BY MANY FOR DOING SO. WHICH, WHICH WAS -- PART OF THE STRUGGLE. HOW, HOW I WAS, PRETENDING TO BE SOMEBODY I WASN'T. SOMEBODY SO FAR FROM WHO I REALLY AM, BUT THAT PERSON, THAT CAM, THAT BOY WAS ACCEPTED BY MANY. ACCEPTED BY, BY THE WHITE MEN AT THE SCHOOL. HE WAS ACCEPTED BY THE SPORTS TEAM AT THE SCHOOL. I

COULD BE IN THE WEIGHT ROOM. WITH GUYS, WITH BOYS. AND THAT MALE ENVIRONMENT THAT I CRAVED FOR SO LONG. BECAUSE I NEVER REALLY HAD FRIENDS. WHEN I MOVED HERE. A PICTURE FROM MY SOPHOMORE YEAR. UP UNTIL THAT POINT I CAME HERE. END OF SIXTH GRADE. FROM SIXTH GRADE TO MY SOPHOMORE YEAR OF HIGH SCHOOL, I WOULD CALL IT THE CAM PHASE, THE PHASE OF, THE ERA OF MINE, WHERE I WAS JUST TRYING TO FIT IN. ALL I WANTED WAS TO HAVE FRIENDS. TO HAVE A COMMUNITY. TO BE ACCEPTED. TO HAVE A PLACE WHERE I COULD BE MYSELF. YOU KNOW? THAT CAME WITH A LOT OF, YOU KNOW, UPS AND DOWNS, AND I WOULD SAY, THERE WERE, I NEVER REALLY -- HAD ANY SORT

OF, OF --

HOW WOULD I CALL IT? NEVER HAD ANY SORT OF CONSCIOUSNESS AT THE TIME. I WAS -- I WAS SO -- SO YOUNG. SO, FOE COULDED ON THE SUPERFICIAL. FOCUSED ON THE LOOKS. FOCUSED ON, ON, HOW OTHERS PERCEIVED ME THAT I NEVER REALLY GOT TO DO ANY INTERNAL WORK AND LOOK AT THE STUFF THAT I HAD LIVED SO FAR. LOST ALL OF THE CONNECTIONS THAT I HAD, MY FRIENDS, FAMILY. THE CULTURE

THAT HAD RAISED ME. AND, STARTED FROM ZERO. I WAS NOBODY.

NOBODY KNEW ME. SO IN A WAY, I GOT TO, SORT OF REBRAND

MYSELF. AND, AND, AND FIGURE OUT. I HAVE ALWAYS BEEN

VERY --

I ANALYZE THINGS A LOT. SO, I WOULD -- WHEN I FIRST CAME
HERE I WAS, NOTICING, THE PATTERNS, THE GUYS, HOW THE BOYS
MOVED, HOW THE GUYS, HAD THEIR FRIEND GROUPS, GIRLS HAD
THEIR FRIEND GROUPS. BUT GIRLS ARE NICER. SO THE GIRLS WERE
BEING NICER TO ME BECAUSE I WAS, THE NEW GUY, SO THEY
WOULD, THEY WOULD GO OUT WITH ME. THEY WOULD, TAKE ME TO

JUST, SHE WAS BEING NICE TO ME.

BEING MY FRIEND. TELLING ME, CAMMILO, YOU ARE TOO WHITE TO

BE LATINO, BUT TOO LATINO TO BE WHITE. THAT AS A 7th

GRADER, A YEAR INTO, INTO BEING IN THIS COUNTRY, REALLY -
IT STRUCK ME. I HAD NEVER THOUGHT ABOUT THAT. NEVER THOUGHT

WHAT THAT MEANT. FOR ME THAT MEANT, I GET NOTHING FROM

THAT'S THE LEFT. CAM. ON THE 19th OF APRIL. THAT'S WHAT I

MEAN MY FIRST AWAKENING. CAM UNTIL THE 19th OF APRIL, 2018.

ALL OF A SUDDEN, I -- I WAS FORCED OUT OF THAT, SLAPPED OUT

OF THAT, THE CHARACTER THAT I WAS PLAYING FOR MANY YEARS IN

FRONT OF THE PEOPLE. ALL OF A SUDDEN I NOW HAD TO --

I NOW -- SAW PAIN, I SAW SUFFERING, I SAW KILLINGS IN MY HOME. I SAW -- I SAW BLOOD BEING SPILLED IN THE STREETS THAT I WALKED WHEN I WAS A KID. I SAW MY ELEMENTARY, KINDERGARTEN, IN MANAGUA THAT I WENT TO THAT MY COUSINS WENT TO, MY PARENTS REALLY CARED ABOUT, BURN. AND BECAUSE, THERE WERE PROTESTERS HIDING IN THE CAMPUS. SO THIS CHILDHOOD, PLACE, HOLDS A LOT OF MEMORIES FOR ME WAS DESTROYED, LITERALLY. SO THAT KIND OF PUSHED ME -- OUT OF -- OUT OF THAT, THAT CHARACTER. AND LIKE, LITERALLY A DAY. BY THE 20th, BY, BY NOW, YOU KNOW, 21ST, I BECAME --MIL OPEN, NOT, NOT YET EXACTLY. BUT I HAD, I WAS FORCED OUT OF IT. BECAUSE THEN I, I CAN'T -- I SORT OF GET LIKE A NEW SET OF EYES. THAT I NOW FULLY COMMIT MYSELF. AND, SINCE THEN IT HAS BEEN THAT WAY, FULLY COMMIT MYSELF TO THE COMMUNITY. I SUDDENLY FOUND ONE. I SUDDENLY FOUND, NICARAGUANS HERE IN THE U.S., IN THE D.C. AREA. THAT WERE FEELING THE FEELINGS I FELT. A LOT OF THEM WERE OLDER. I WAS ON THE YOUNGER SIDE OF THOSE GROUPS. I HAVE A VOICE, SKILL, THAT CAN HELP ME SERVE MY COMMUNITY. AND I WILL BREAK DOWN EACH OF THE IMAGES I ATTACHED ON HERE. SUDDENLY, I CAN HELP, BESIDES JUST CRYING ABOUT IT IN MY ROOM. AND, IN WRITING ABOUT IT. AND, AND, COMPLAINTS TO PEOPLE ABOUT

IT. I CAN TAKE ACTION. I ACTUALLY CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE.

AND, THAT LEADS ME TO ONE OF THE FIRST VIDEO I WANT TO SHOW YOU ALL, WHICH WAS, THE INDIVIDUALLY I LITERALLY MADE. I THINK ON THE 20TH, APRIL, THREE YEARS AGO. WHICH JUST, YOU KNOW, LIKE ALL OF THIS IS GOING ON. NOBODY CARES. MEDIA IS NOT COVERING. I WANT TO MAKE A VIDEO. AND I GOT TO PUT IT OUT. AND I THINK IF YOU HAD ANY WORRY AT ALL WHETHER OR NOT YOUR WORK IS HELPING, JUST THIS TALK ALONE, 100% HELPED ME AND I KNOW OTHER PEOPLE HERE TO GOT A BETTER UNDERSTANDING OF SOME THINGS THAT -- THAT'S WHAT, YOU KNOW, THAT'S WHY WE DO THESE, THESE WEBINARS IS BECAUSE WE REALLY BELIEVE THAT UNDERSTANDING IS WHAT LEADS TO LOVE AND WHAT LEADS TO COMPASSIONATE ACTION. SO WE ARE HOPING THAT FROM, COMING TO THE WEBINARS, PEOPLE UNDERSTAND MORE AND WILL BE MOVED TO DO MORE. JUST LIKE YOU HAVE BEEN DOING. SO, JUST WANTED TO SAY THAT. AND BEFORE WE OPEN THE FLOOR. IF YOU HAVE A QUESTION, YOU CAN UNMUTE YOURSELF. ASK HIM A QUESTION. OR GIVE HIM A COMMENT, COMMENT ABOUT HIS PRESENTATION. WHATEVER IT IS YOU HAVE. PUT SOMETHING IN THE CHAT. CAN WE, MAYBE, YOU WANT TO SPEAK THAT OUTLOUD OR WAIT UNTIL AFTER CLAIRE SPEAKS. I LOVE WHAT YOU ARE SAYING THERE. SO I REALLY, IT WAS AWESOME. IT WAS VERY BEAUTIFUL. AND I AM READING WHAT I WROTE, ACTUALLY. SO I LOVED HOW YOU DESCRIBE LATINOS AS VICTIMS AND VICTIMIZERS. WHAT WOULD YOU TELL

PEOPLE WHO LOOK AT LATINOS AS MARGINALIZED AND UNDERPRIVILEGED PEOPLE WITH, LITTLE CAPITAL, LIKE CULTURAL CAPITAL AND SOCIAL CAPITAL. THANK YOU, I APPRECIATE THAT OUESTION. IT IS A PROBLEM. BECAUSE AGAIN WITHIN OUR OWN COMMUNITY. NOT EVERYONE IS AT THE SAME PLACE. YOU KNOW. AND, AND, NOT EVERYBODY, WHO COMES HERE, COMES WITH THE SAME SITUATIONS. LIKE, WITH THE SAME STRUGGLES TO DEAL WITH, YOU KNOW. THE DICTATORS IN LATIN AMERICA ARE LATINOS JUST LIKE US. THEY COULD LOOK JUST AS SOMEBODY WHO IS OPPRESSED AND VULNERABLE. I DON'T THINK IT'S --I MAY NOT BE ANSWERING YOUR QUESTION. BUT I THINK WE HAVE TO -- LOOK AT, US, AND I THINK IT IS, PART OF EDUCATING AND HAVING THESE CONVERSATIONS WHERE, WHERE --YOU KNOW WE LEARN THAT -- THAT IT IS, IT IS SO DIVERSE, YOU CAN'T JUST, THE, BECAUSE-UP ARE LATINO DOESN'T MEAN YOU, YOU STRUGGLE WITH THE SAME PEOPLE. WITH THE SAME THINGS EVERYBODY ELSE STRUGGLES WITH. AND LIKE I WAS SAG BEFORE, LIKE -- EVEN THOUGH -- YOU KNOW, I'M NOT, THE MOST PRIVILEGED PERSON ON EARTH. I THINK I AM SUPER PRIVILEGED WITHIN MY OWN COMMUNITY. AND, YOU KNOW, IT, IS ALL ABOUT WHO -- WHO, RELATIVE TO WHAT YOU ARE COMPARING IT TO I GUESS. SO, OBVIOUSLY, IF -- IF, I, I PUT MYSELF AGAINST --

I DON'T KNOW, SUPER WEALTHY -- YOU KNOW, THIRD GENERATION,
LIKE, LIKE, RICH PERSON, YEAH, I'M SO, BELOW ON THE SCALE
OF PRIVILEGE. I THINK IT IS ALL RELATIVE TO THINGS. PEOPLE
HAVE GOT TO BE AWARE OF THAT. YOU CAN'T JUST THROW
EVERYBODY IN A BOX. IT'S NOT GOOD FOR US. ALSO TO SEE
OURSELVES AS MARGINALIZED. BECAUSE WE ARE NOT. WE ARE, BUT,
BUT, BUT WE ALSO HAVE TO EMPOWER EACH OTHER TO LOOK BEYOND
THAT. TO, TO, SEE THAT WE HAVE SO MUCH HISTORY, WE HAVE SO
MUCH TO BE PROUD ABOUT, TO BE ASHAMED ABOUT, TO, TO,
SHARE WITH OTHERS, SO IT IS SO, DIVERSE. YOU KNOW? IT'S,

IT'S COOL BUT ALSO NOT. HOW THAT IS. HOW COMPLEX IT IS. >> CAMILO MONTOYA: THANK YOU.

>> I WAS JUST GOING TO THANK YOU SO MUCH.

ONE THING THAT STRUCK ME ABOUT YOUR STORY -- IS PARTLY TRUE
OF MANY ADOLESCENTS WHERE YOU FIND YOURSELF AND YOUR
COMMUNITY AT THE SAME TIME. THAT WAS SO BEAUTIFULLY SHOWN
IN YOUR SLIDE SHOW WHICH I THOUGHT WAS GREAT. BUT ALSO
SEEMS TO ME SOMETIMES, WHITE AMERICANS WE HAVE SUCH AN
INDIVIDUALISTIC FOCUS THAT, THAT WE STRUGGLE OUR WHOLE
LIVES TO, TO FEEL A SENSE OF COMMUNITY, THE WAY THAT YOU
EXPRESSED IT. AND I JUST, I JUST WANTED TO, TO, THANK YOU

FOR, SHOWING IN YOUR TALK HOW IMPORTANT THAT IS. >> CAMILO MONTOYA: THANK YOU, THANK YOU, I SEE THAT IN MY FRIENDS AND PEOPLE THAT I KNOW A THE LOT. OFTEN TIMES IT IS LIKE, IS LIKE, HERE ARE, THESE GOOD, LIKE, SOCIALLY ORIENTED PEOPLE AND, AND, LIKE MY WHITE FRIENDS WHO STRUGGLE WITH, STRUGGLE WITH THAT COMMUNITY TO FIND, AND, AND, I THINK THAT IN SOME WAYS THAT, THAT -- MAKES ME PRIVILEGED. LOOK I DO HAVE A STRUGGLE. I DO HAVE -- LIKE A COMMUNITY THAT, THAT I COULD HELP, AND, SO --IT'S ALSO, IN THAT, THAT GOES BACK TO, TO THE, TO MAGDA'S QUESTION, ALL ABOUT, RELATIVE TO HOW YOU LOOK AT IT. IT IS LIKE I AM, SO THANKFUL THAT I HAVE A COMMUNITY THAT I CAN, THAT I CAN, EXPRESS TO AND I CAN HELP. AND I CAN --COMMIT MY LIFE TO. THAT OTHERS MAY FEEL LOOK THEY DON'T. AND I, DIE TO THINK THEY DO. I THINK EVERYBODY CAN FIND A COMMUNITY. SO I DON'T, THAT'S WHY I DON'T --I DON'T CRITICIZE PEOPLE WHO, WHO REALLY, FIND A WAY TO MAKE A COMMUNITY. LIKE MY WHITE FRIENDS, MAY BE NOT COOL TO SAY, MY WHITE FRIENDS WILL DYE THEIR HAIR CRAZY COLORS, THAT'S THEIR WAY OF FINDING COMMUNITY. I LOVE THAT I MAKE FUN OF THEM. WHY IS YOUR HAIRPINNING? I LOVE IT. I LOVE THAT, THAT IS A TRAIT THAT YOU CAN SHARE WITH OTHERS. AND

COMMENT TO, SOCIALIZE TO OTHER AS BUT. I DEFINITELY SEE WHAT YOU ARE SAYING. AND I AGREE. I HAVE A QUESTION AND COMMENT. ONE WHEN YOU WERE DESCRIBING HOW --HOW YOU FELT LIKE YOU WANTED, THERE WAS, YOU WERE STRUGGLING WITH IDENTITY AND HOW THE WHITE TEAM WAS THE WINNING TEAM. THAT JUST BROKE MY HEART. THAT, THAT, YOU HAD TO KIND OF FACE THAT AND WORK, WITH BOTH OF THOSE IDENTITIES. AND, IT SEEMS LIKE THAT IS AN ART ITSELF. JUST HAVING TO BALANCE -- THOSE TWO IDENTITIES. SOMETHING THAT WAS HEALING TO YOU. WHAT WAS THE MEDIUM? AND
WHEN, WHEN WAS THAT? DO YOU RECALL?

PERFORMED, THE SPOKEN WORD, THAT WAS MY THIRD PERFORMANCE.
THE FIRST TIME I, PERFORMED IT WAS ACTUALLY DURING

REHEARSAL FURS THAT EVENT. THAT'S WHAT'S WEIRD ABOUT THAT

IT IS, SUCH A PERSONAL, YOU DON'T WANT, YOU DON'T WANT TO

DO ATE AGAIN. BUT I HAD TO REHER IT IN AN EMPTY, IN THIS

EMPTY AUDITORIUM AT SCHOOL. THERE WAS LIKE ONE PERSON, ONE,

THERE WAS ONE, MS. OWENS IS HER NAME, ONE AFRICAN-AMERICAN

TEACHER ALL THE WAY IN THE BACK. SNUCK IN TO SEE THE

PERFORMANCE.

THIS WAS BEFORE, ANYBODY ELSE SAW IT. SHE SNUCK IN TO SEE

IT. AND SHE CAME UP AND SHE WAS LIKE, CAMILO, LOOK I CAN'T

BELIEVE YOU, YOU JUST SAID THAT. WHAT DO YOU MEAN? I CAN'T

BELIEVE THAT, JUST CAME OUT OF YOU, YOU DON'T, SHE HAS HAD

ME IN CLASS YOU

DON'T SHARE THAT STUFF. YOU DON'T LIKE, LIKE, NOW I

UNDERSTAND WHY YOU ARE UPSET IN THE CORNER. WHY YOU SKIP

>> CAMILO MONTOYA: BCC IS ROUGH. THANK YOU FOR ASKING THAT,
RENATA. WHAT I, WHAT I SAW, AT BCC WAS --

AND, AND IT WAS JUST THAT --

AND I SAW IT, NOT JUST, NOT, BECAUSE EVERYBODY SEES IT, SO

CLEAR. CLEARLY, BCC IS CLEARLY SEGREGATED. BUT I WAS IN IT.

BECAUSE --

FOR MY FIRST TWO YEARS I WAS WALKING. I WAS EATING. I WAS,
HANGING OUT WITH THE WHITE SIDE. SO I WAS ON ONE SIDE OF
THE SCHOOL. AND SUDDENLY I LEAVE THE SPACE FOREVER. I AM A
THREAT TO THEM.

I AM THE WOKE KID. I CAN CALL THEM RACISTS NOW BECAUSE THEY SAY RACIST STUFF. THEY CAN'T MAKE RACIST JOKES AROUND ME ANYMORE, MY HAIR IS LONGER. MY CURLS ARE SHOWING. NOW IT, IT IS A FLAG THAT I HAVE. AND SO THEN, THAT'S WHEN -- WHEN I STARTED LIVING THE, THE ACTUALLY STARTED LIVING WHAT IT WAS LOOK TO BE HISPANIC AT BCC. I WOULD TAKE, THROUGHOUT MY DAY, I HAD, AP CLASSES, AND LIKE HONORS CLASSES, LOWER LEVEL ONES.

I WOULD GO FROM ONE SIDE OF THE SCHOOL, ALL WHITE KIDS,
WHERE IN THE CLASS RAM I FELT LIKE THE OUTSIDER. TO THEN,

THE ON LEVEL CLASS. MATH CLASS. IT WAS ALL, BLACK AND
LATINO KIDS. AND, I WAS AT HOME. WE COULD JOKE AROUND.
WE COULD SHARE ABOUT OUR DAYS WEEVIL COULD TALK ABOUT
ANYTHING. AND, AND, EVEN, IT SUCKS BECAUSE IT IS IN A CLASS
WHERE I FELL AT HOME THE MOST, WHERE I FELT LISTENED TO THE

MOST, AND HAD A COMMUNITY, WERE THE CLASSES THEY DIDN'T REALLY HELP MY GPA THEY WERE ON-LEVEL CLASSES. SO IT

IT REALLY SCREWED MY, MY, IDEA OF EDUCATION, SENSE OF
EDUCATION. THEN IT BECAME, WELL, IT WAS EITHER COMMUNITY
BUILDING OR, EDUCATION, ADVANCING IN MY EDUCATION. IT WAS,
EITHER, YOU CHALLENGE YOURSELF, ECONOMICALLY, READ HARDER
BOOKS AND ASSIGNMENTS OR YOU FEEL WELCOMED IN A CLASSROOM.
WHICH I WILL ALWAYS VALUE THAT OVER ANYTHING. REALLY LIKE,
LIKE, SURE MAYBE I DIDN'T PUSH MYSELF LIKE I COULD HAVE AT
SCHOOL. I DIDN'T DO ASSIGNMENTS I SHOULD HAVE DONE. BUT I
CHOSE LATINO, LATINO, AND BLACK KIDS THAT BECAME MY
COMMUNITY. THE COMMUNITY. THOSE ARE THE ONES THAT CARRY ME.
AND, AND, AND, I LOVE YOUR, THE FIRST -- QUESTION, THAT YOU
SAID, IN THAT -- THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN LATINOS? HOW,

EVEN WITH THOSE LATINOS THERE WERE STILL SO MANY

DIFFERENCES BECAUSE SOME OF THEM WERE UNDOCUMENTED. SOME OF

THEM WERE U.S. BORN. SOME OF THEM JUST TURNED CITIZENS.

AND, OTHERS WERE SUPER, SUPER WEALTHY, LATINOS, SUPER,

SUPER POOR LATINOS.

SO EVEN WITHIN, THAT GROUP THAT LABEL OF THAT

CLASSIFICATION, LATINOS THERE IS STILL SUCH A DIVISION THAT I FELT. AND AGAIN, LIKE I'M NOT ON EITHER EXTREME ALSO. SO, YET, YET AGAIN I FOUND MYSELF IN THIS, IN THIS IN BETWEEN. WHERE IS LIKE, WELL I DON'T REALLY LIKE THE WEALTHY KIDS AT ALL. ACTUALLY. THE WEALTHY LATINOS. I DON'T KNOW WHAT THAT IS LIKE. I CAN UNDERSTAND, WHAT IS LOOK FOR THESE KIDS. SO IT WAS STILL, THERE IS STILL, WASN'T LIKE A COMMUNITY. YOU CAN FIND COMMUNITIES WITHIN THE GROUPS. AND, IT HELPED ME A LOT. I GUESS. YEP. ANY

OTHER QUESTIONS, YOU ARE SO SMART. YOU HAVE A PH TK-FPL,
LIKE, GOING TO HAVE A PH TK-FPL, I'M NOT THE ONE YOU SHOULD
BE ASKING THAT TO.
